After completing their research, students used what they learned to complete the "Elemental Superhero" project. Each student had to turn their chosen element into a personified character—either an awesome superhero defending the planet or a sneaky villain threatening it. Even though these characters were created from their imagination, they still had to keep the science real. That meant the student-created character's look, special powers, costume, and core personality had to directly reflect and symbolize the actual physical and chemical properties of their element.
